



Licensure Disclosures by State

Professional Licensure and Certification Requirements

Each state and territory have different professional licensure and certification requirements. Huntington Junior College is working to confirm if programs meet the educational prerequisites for professional licensure or certification outside the state of West Virginia. Other licensure requirements may include professional examinations, background checks, years of work experience, fingerprinting requirements, etc. Students who are considering an academic program that may allow them to pursue professional licensure in their state or territory are strongly encouraged to check their state's or territory's information below and contact the appropriate licensing agency to seek information and additional guidance before beginning a program outside of their state.

Please note that HJC teaches to the license and certification standards of West Virginia. If you plan to work in any state other than those mentioned above, it is your responsibility to verify that state's permit, license or certification requirements before enrolling in an HJC program. A state's requirement may include, among other things, specialized training that is not required in the states where HJC has a physical presence and as a result may not be sufficiently covered in HJC's curriculum. HJC disclaims responsibility for failure of any student to meet the educational requirements for a permit, license or certification in any jurisdiction other than West Virginia.

Potential changes in requirements: Students who plan to pursue licensure outside of the states where HJC has a physical presence should be aware that state licensure requirements are subject to changes. While a program may originally meet the educational requirements for licensure, changes in requirements could affect the program's ability to meet any new educational requirements.

An IMPORTANT NOTE for anyone relocating during the course of a program: Prospective and current students should keep in mind that licensing and authorization requirements vary by state and that relocating during the course of a program to another state could impact whether that student can continue in the course, meet the eligibility requirements of that state, and/or receive financial aid funding. If students are considering relocating, they should contact the Student Services Office to check for authorization and licensure eligibility requirements.
